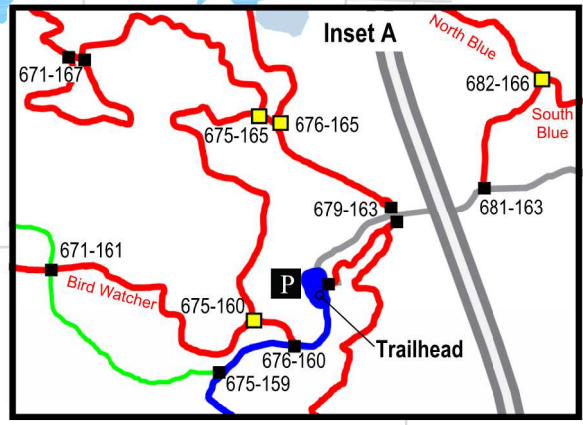


Riders who use the MRT and this map do so at their own risk.

The Paul Bunyan State Forest is designated as **LIMITED USE**. You may ride your vehicle **ONLY** on signed and mapped routes that are open for the type of OHV you are using.

CAUTION
All trails and forest roads have two way traffic. Watch for oncoming vehicles and other forest users.

LIMITED USE FOREST

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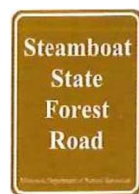


Off Highway Motorcycle (OHM) trails are marked with this red sign.



These trails are red on the map.

You may also ride on dual use trails (blue), forest roads and minimum maintenance roads within the forest (gray).



You may **NOT** ride on:

- _ shoulder of state and county roads (ditches)
- _ walking trails
- _ trails marked for ATV only (green)



All motorcycles NOT registered in Minnesota will require a Non-resident OHV State Trail Pass. See http://www.dnr.state.mn.us/ohv/nonres_pass.html for more information.

HOW TO READ THE MAP

Trail intersections are signed using the MN Emergency Trail Locator System.



The numbers are the GPS coordinate of the intersection and are also on the borders of the map.

Use the first three numbers on the sign and the numbers on the top and bottom of the map to find your location left to right on the map.

Use the last three numbers and the numbers on the sides of the map to find your vertical location.

The intersection of these two lines is your location.

Trail mileages shown on the map are the distance in miles between the open intersection points. ■

THINGS TO KNOW

Call **911** in case of an emergency. Responders can find you quicker if you can tell them the map coordinates you are near.

All trails and roads are bi-directional. Be aware of oncoming traffic.

Paul Bunyan State Forest is generally open from May 1 through October 31, but may be closed due to weather, logging, special events, or road work. Check the DNR website for closure notifications.

Your OHM must be registered and all trail system users must follow the MN DNR Off-Highway Vehicle Regulations. For complete details of the items above, visit the DNR website at: mndnr.gov/ohv

Trails may vary from this map due to weather conditions, logging, etc.

LOCATION

The Martineau Off Highway Motorcycle (OHM) Trail System is located in the Paul Bunyan State Forest, starting approximately three miles north of Akeley, MN on Highway 64.
